Atul spoke about the vision for Viksit Bharat 2047 encompassing a comprehensive transformation of India into a developed nation by its centenary of independence. Key goals span various sectors, including the economy, education, healthcare, infrastructure, and technology, aiming for a holistic and inclusive growth model. Achieving sustainable economic growth is crucial, with strategies focusing on green economy initiatives, renewable energy adoption, and sustainable industrial practices. He emphasised on inclusive growth, ensuring that benefits reach all sections of society.

Technological advancements and digital transformation will play a pivotal role in driving innovation and development. Enhancing digital infrastructure, expanding internet access, and improving digital literacy are foundational steps. Integrating emerging technologies such as AI

and machine learning across various sectors will further bolster India's development trajectory. In education, the focus will be on enhancing quality and accessibility, providing vocational training and skill development to match future job market demands, and promoting learning in higher education institutions.

The panellists also discussed other aspects for achieving Viksit Bharat 2047, like healthcare and social welfare are critical areas, with goals to strengthen the healthcare system and ensure universal health coverage; Good governance and policy reforms fundamental for strengthening democratic institutions to attract foreign investment and ease of doing business are key strategies; Anti-corruption measures and ensuring transparency in government operations to foster trust and efficiency; Modernization of agriculture and rural development through technology and sustainable practices, enhancing rural livelihoods and reducing poverty were brainstormed including the improvement of infrastructure development in rural areas to improve the quality of life for rural populations; Empowering youth and women for leadership roles, with gender equality initiatives and programs for women's economic empowerment; Engaging youth in nation-building activities and fostering innovation will drive future growth; Environmental conservation and climate action strategies will combat climate change and environmental degradation, promoting sustainable practices in industries and communities while conserving natural resources and biodiversity.

Global engagement and partnerships were also taken up during discussions for leveraging international opportunities in trade, technology exchange, and investment. Strengthening international relations and promoting India as a global leader in various sectors will be strategic priorities. To achieve these ambitious goals, a clear roadmap with short-term and long-term milestones must be established. Regular assessment and feedback mechanisms will track progress, ensuring collaborative efforts between the government, private sector, and civil society. A call to action will encourage collective participation from all sectors of society, highlighting the role of individual citizens in realizing the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047. All speakers agreed that a shared commitment will inspire and drive the nation towards achieving this transformative vision.
